Recent Events

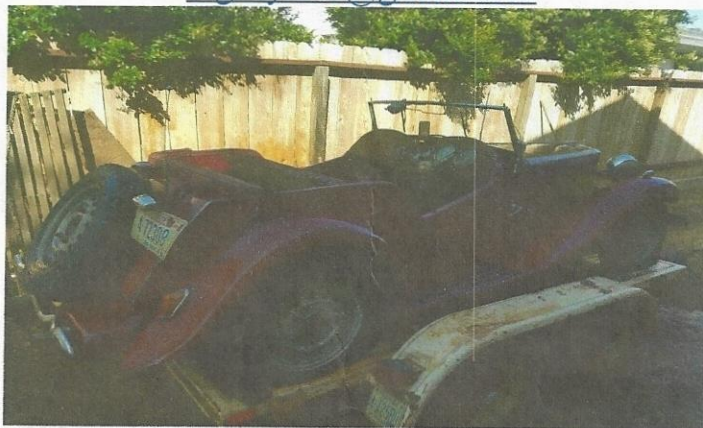
